USM bags 19 ITEX awards

> Asthma treatment, special foam among winning inventions

GEORGE TOWN: A new treatment to manage asthma helped Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) bag one of its 19 gold awards, won during the recently concluded Invention, Innovation and Technology Exhibition (ITEX).

Dr Nurul Asma Abdullah of the School of Dental Sciences at USM said the treatment, called "BreatheEzi", is aimed at managing asthma without the use of chemicals.

She said it took her two years to develop, adding that the main ingredient is sclerotium, which is derived from tiger milk mushrooms.

"This helps in reducing common asthma symptoms and promotes better respiratory health," she said at a press conference yesterday.

Another winning invention was the Eco-

RubFOAM by Prof Dr Hanafi ismail of the School of Materials and Mineral Resources.

The foam is made from rubber waste and can be molded into any shape and size such as mattresses and can also be used as a soundproofing material.

"The foam is a costeffective, easy and modern way to reduce sound or noise in many places or situations," he said, adding that the product could help reduce industrial rubber

USM deputy vicechancellor Prof Dr Muhamad Jantan congratulated all winners and urged them to come up with better products.

He said the university had participated in ITEX since 2006 as it provided a platform for inventions to gain wider recognition, which could lead to commercialisation opportunities.

"The procurement process will be done through an open or limited tender process based on Commonwealth standards to facilitate cost effectiveness and best value for money," he told a press conference yesterday.
